**REFUND POLICY**

Refund deadlines vary for classes during each term. To qualify for a refund, a student must officially withdraw from the class by the Refund Deadline date on page 1.

Refunds, less a \$10.00 processing fee, will be processed automatically beginning March 9th and will either be mailed to the student's address on file with Admissions and Records, or returned as a credit to the credit card from which fees were originally paid. See Refund Policy in the Course Catalog for more information. Refunds of less than \$10 will not be processed and must be requested in person from the Bursar's Office.

**REFUND DEADLINES**

Pursuant to Section 58508 of Subchapter 6 of Chapter 9 or Division 6, Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations, a community college district shall not refund any enrollment fee or differential enrollment fee paid by a student for program changes made after the first two weeks of instruction for a primary term-length course, or after the 10 percent point of the length of the course for a short-term course, unless the program change is a result of action by the district to cancel or reschedule a class or to drop a student pursuant to Section 58106 (g) where the student fails to meet a prerequisite or fails to drop by the deadline.

**RETURNED CHECK SERVICE CHARGE**

Checks returned for non-sufficient funds or "Stop Payments" will be charged a \$25.00 service fee. There will be a hold put on your records and your enrollment at College of the Desert, and your credit may be affected.

### Enrollment Fee Deadline for Spring 2022

- To avoid being dropped from classes for non-payment, students must pay within three (3) days of registration for the Spring 2022 term. Count the day you enroll as the first day to prevent being dropped for non-payment.
- Students registering on or after January 31st, must pay enrollment fees prior to the last day to drop a course. A financial hold will be placed on all student records that have an outstanding balance for the term that will prevent subsequent registration until paid.
- Drops for non-payment will not be processed once courses begin. Drops for non-payment will not be processed once the term begins.
- Students enrolled in courses they do not attend are responsible for enrollment fees and final grades if not dropped by applicable course deadline. If you have been awarded financial aid, you will not be dropped for non-payment.
- Petitions to drop past the deadline, or for refunds of courses not dropped by the deadline, will not be accepted if student fails to drop a course by the deadline.

### Payment Plan Option

College of the Desert offers an optional payment plan to assist with the payment of enrollment fees. Please note there is a \$20 administrative processing fee per semester for this service. ### The following terms are used throughout this Schedule of classes.

**SECT/SYNONYM (in WebAdvisor) - SECTION NUMBER:** Every class is identified by a 4-digit section number. This number is critical to correctly register in the section you have selected.

**COURSE - COURSE CODE:** The course code identifies the department and course level.

**TITLE - COURSE TITLE:** The course title is the descriptive name of the course.

**U - UNITS:** This is the number of credit units that will be earned by successfully completing the course.

**SHORT-TERM CLASSES** - Short-term classes are noted throughout the schedule with starting (First Meeting:) and ending dates (Last Meeting:) listed under the class title in **bold print**. Registration deadline dates for these classes will differ from the published deadlines for full-term classes.

**CROSS-LISTED or EQUIVALENT SECTIONS** - One or more like courses scheduled at the same time. Enrollments of all cross-listed courses are considered by the registration system, possibly showing "course is filled" when it seems there are available seats.

**TBA TIME** - If hours are shown as 2.3 HOURS TBA, then 2 hours and 5 minutes weekly are required (usually lab) and are TO BE ARRANGED by the student during the time the appropriate lab facility is open.

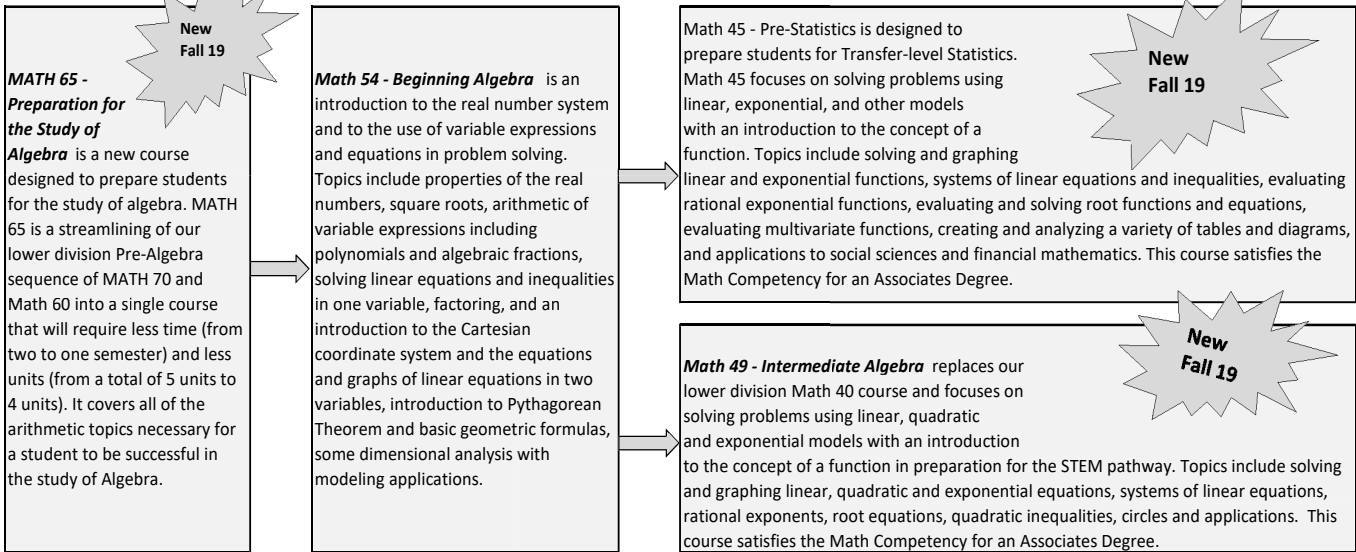
If an emergency exists that is severe or life threatening, call (911), then the Department of Public Safety. If you have questions about the Department, stop in the office and your questions can be answered.

Assembly Bill (AB) 705

The State of California has enacted a new law affecting community college students. Assembly Bill 705 requires colleges to maximize the probability that students will complete transfer-level English and math within one year. The assessment test for English and math will no longer be administered and all students can now directly enroll in transfer-level English and math courses.

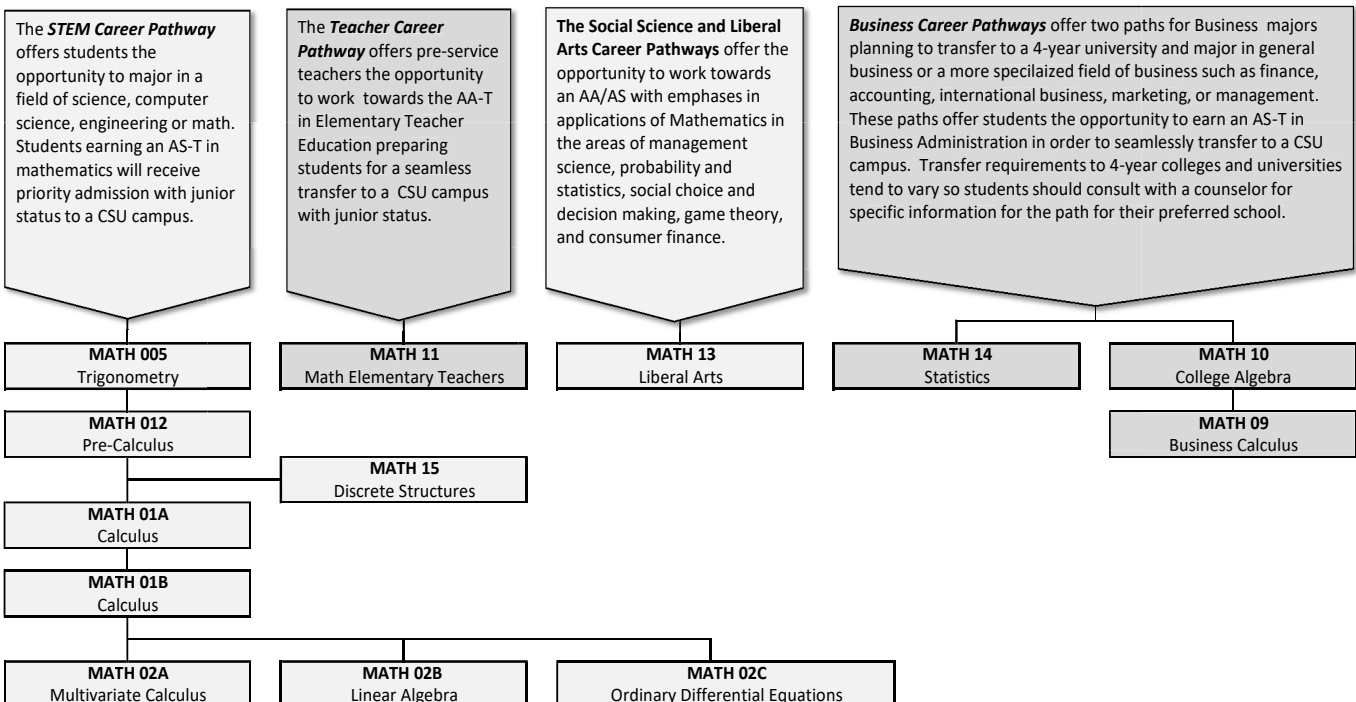

# COVID-19 SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

**Do not enter campus if you are not feeling well and have any symptoms of COVID-19**, including cough, fever, shortness of breath or a new loss of taste or smell.

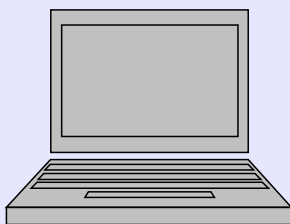

**What Is Work Experience?**

A course that allows students to apply their education to the real world. Students create and accomplish three measurable learning objectives that are new and/or expanded responsibilities at their workplace. This ultimately empowers students to become better employees, work on new projects, add to their resume, and enhance their job skills. All students who currently work, volunteer, intern, or that have a student worker or federal work study position are eligible. Units earned are transferrable to the CSU system and the class fits easily into the student's work and school schedule. Students may enroll in General Work Experience or an Occupational course.

**General Work Experience (WEG – 095A)**

Students may enroll in **General Work Experience (WEG – 095A)** if the student's current position **does not** relate to their occupational/educational goal. Students can earn **1 - 6 units** of General Work Experience per semester (if hour requirement is met, see below). All General sections will be listed under Work Experience.

**Occupational Work Experience (XXX – 095A)**

Students may enroll in an Occupational course if their current position **does** relate to their educational/occupational goal. Occupational courses vary depending on students major and are listed under the corresponding academic program as **(XXX – 095A)**, i.e. CIS-095A, BUMA-095A, FIRE-095A, etc. Students may earn 1-8 units in any occupational work experience course (if hour requirement is met, see below). Additional occupational courses may be available if not listed on WebAdvisor.

**Note to Students:** Use the chart below to help you pre-determine up to how many units you may qualify to earn based on the number of hours you will complete. You must **manually** enter the number of units via WebAdvisor if you are enrolling in more than one (1) unit (see image on next page). ## Accounting

The Bureau of Labor Statistics projects that 166,700 new accounting and auditing jobs will open up by 2022. This means the demand for well-educated accounting professionals will increase over 13 percent between now and then. Organizations large to small, domestic or global require financial guidance from professionals with accounting knowledge who can prepare, analyze, verify, and communicate financial information.

Most students don't realize the variety of accounting jobs the profession has to offer. Whereas, Forensic Accountants merge accounting with investigative legal work, Public Accountants are tasked with accounting, auditing, taxes, and consulting. Management Accountants work with decision makers within a company, and Non-Profit/Government Accountants are employed by various public agencies.

At College of the Desert students interested in pursuing a career in accounting can earn either a Certificate of Achievement in Accounting, an A.S. degree in accounting for employment preparation, or both, providing students with the skills necessary for employment or advancement in the accounting profession.

Additionally, students can earn a Bachelor's Degree without ever leaving the desert! Just complete the transfer AA Business Degree at COD and then finish the upper division accounting program at the Palm Desert campus of CSUSB.

Have you ever wondered why and how the planets orbit around the sun? Have you thought about black holes and time travel? If so, then Descriptive Astronomy, A-001 or A-002 will give you an opportunity to learn the answers to all these questions, plus learn how COD's state of the art, remotely operated 1-meter telescope at the Mary Reagan Observatory works.

Both A-001 and A-002 fulfill the natural science elective and will transfer to the UCs and Cal States. The only difference is A-002 is a (4) unit class that includes a laboratory component, while A-001 is a (3) unit lecture only class. Also, if you need a natural science elective with a lab, A-002 fills that requirement.

In addition to a natural science elective, these courses are also worthwhile for science majors who plan to pursue a career in Physics, Astronomy, Astrophysics or Space Science.

The characteristics of mammals is briefly covered in Biology (BI 004) and Biology of Organisms (BI 006). Biology of Mammals (BI 007) covers all the major orders of mammals in depth, as well as their anatomy and physiology, ecology, evolution, distribution, domestication, and conservation.

The lecture and lab are designed to fulfill the natural science elective (same as BI 004) and have been accepted for transfer to the UCs and Cal States. This is the only biology course offered in the science department in which the lecture and lab are two separate courses, so that if students need only one or the other, they can be accommodated.

In addition to a natural science elective, these courses can also be taken by science majors who have fulfilled their biology requirements (BI 005 and BI 006) and want to take more biology while waiting to fulfill the rest of their science requirements (chemistry, math, physics, etc.).

### Biology Facts

- BI-005 & BI-006 are articulated with UC Riverside as UCR's BIOL 5A, 5B and 5C, if both BI-005 and BI-006 are taken at COD.
- BI-005 is not a prerequisite to BI-006; you may take them in any order.

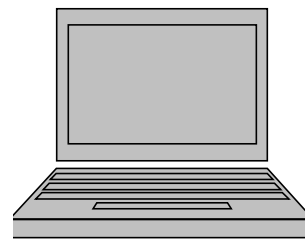

DSPS at College of the Desert is committed to providing students with documented disabilities equal access to a community college education. Through the utilization of specialized instructional programs and disability related support services, DSPS encourages and fosters independence and assists students in attaining their educational and vocational goals.

DSPS course offerings will vary each semester, but all DSPS courses will be offered in person for the Spring 2022 semester. DSPS instructional support trainings are offered virtually through the High Tech Center. The High Tech Center provides students access to adaptive hardware and software to support their academic needs.

WorkAbility III is a jointly funded program between the State Department of Rehabilitation and California Community Colleges to assist students/clients with disabilities in job placement.

Adapted Kinesiology classes are offered during some terms for students with disabilities. Adapted courses can include: Tennis, Badminton, Golf, Yoga, Physical Activity (weight training and fitness), and Fitness Aquatics.

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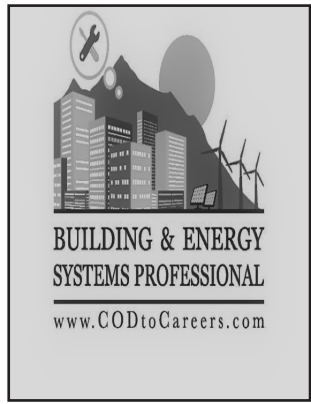

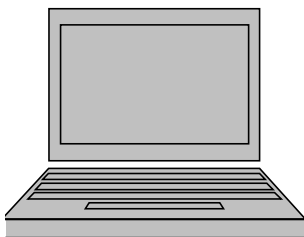

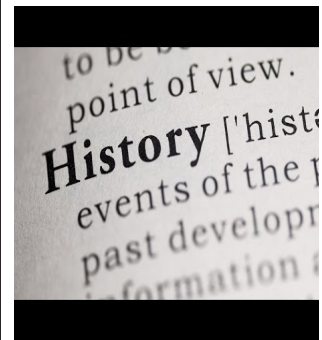

## What Spanish Courses to Take

The following information will help you select the Spanish course you need to take according to your proficiency level.

### Spanish as a Foreign Language Track

A student can take Spanish as a Foreign Language if he/she is a native speaker of English or another foreign language. If a student has never taken Spanish, he/she must be enrolled in SPAN 001-Elementary Spanish I (5 units). If a student has taken 1, 2, or more years of Spanish in high school or another institution, he/she may take the Spanish placement exam to determine his/her proficiency level. He/she may be placed in SPAN 002-Elementary Spanish II (5 units), SPAN 003-Intermediate Spanish I (4 units), or SPAN 004 – Intermediate Spanish II (4 units).

### Spanish for Heritage Speakers Track

A student can be considered as a heritage speaker of Spanish if Spanish and English are spoken at home and/or Spanish is spoken very often. If a student can ask and answer questions orally in Spanish but he/she does not know how to read and write in Spanish, he/she must be enrolled in SPAN 021-Spanish for Heritage Speakers I (5 units). If a student can ask and answer questions orally in Spanish and have basic knowledge of how to read and write in Spanish, he/she must be enrolled in SPAN 022-Spanish for Heritage Speakers II (5 units).

### Spanish Placement Test

To ensure the correct placement in a Spanish course, students can self-enroll in the Spanish Placement Test on CANVAS from 12:00 p.m. - 1:00 p.m. and from 4:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. on November 19, December 3, January 14, and February 4, by using this link: <https://collegeofthedesert.instructure.com/enroll/8FBEHD>
