C. New Program:

1. ADVANCED FILM PRODUCTION CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT

Digital film and video technology has transformed filmmaking, making it possible to produce independent movies and video projects without huge budgets, expensive cameras or large crews. This development allows many different organizations today to use film and video as part of their work. Whether the goal is to fulfill a personal artistic vision,

market a product or advance a cause, the fundamental need to tell a story remains paramount, and film is a powerful means to do it. In this six course certificate program, students receive direct, hands-on experience creating visual stories that are intelligent, emotional, compelling, succinct and informative. The program covers the primary aspects of film production, including scripting, camera, sound, directing, editing and broadcasting. The Advanced Certificate builds on the foundation offered by the Basic Certificate to provide a platform from which to launch further study of film production as well as necessary industry skills, processes and practices to work on a film crew, produce an independent film, create and run a small film/video business and moneitize video in the many social media outlets available today. This certificate also gives students crucial communication and storytelling tools they may apply in almost any area of study where film and video are utilized today. Students emerge with short films and other film project materials for their personal or professional portfolio.

6.1 Completed Goals for 17/18:

- > Implemented Curriculum Training for all Reps and Tech Review Committee
- > Streamlined Technical Review as an online process with face-to-face meetings available 2x a month for faculty with Curriculum Chair
- Passed AP 4022 and has been approved by the board
- > Implemented a 1st and 2nd reading for all new and substantially modified curriculum proposals to allow for more thorough review

- Updated and posted on the Portal a digital Curriculum Handbook, instituted a yearly update to ensure compliance with Title 5 and ACCJC guidelines.
- Worked on the new Program Development Policies and Procedures with Ed Policies and Outcomes and Assessment Committee, has been passed along to the VPI for vetting with CPC and Executive Cabinet.
- Worked on Course Leaf Inventory System, CIM. A task force has been working on creating and customizing the forms. Began the migration from CurricuNET
- ➤ 493 Courses reviewed and approved (19 new credit, 23 new noncredit)
- > 45 Programs reviewed and approved (21 new programs: 17 approved, 4 for approval by CO)
- ➤ 4 New ADTs (33 total ADTs)
