b. Health and Fitness AS Degree and Transfer Preparation

The associate of science degree in health and fitness is a two-year course of study designed for students who are interested in a career in the health and fitness industry and or who wish to transfer to a four year institution in kinesiology, exercise science, health and fitness or related major. The completion of the degree will also prepare students to sit for one of the national personal training examinations developed in partnership with the National Academy of Sports Medicine. Students who wish to transfer to a four-year institution must consult with program faculty and college counselors to insure that the requirements for transfer to appropriate institutions are met.

Career Opportunities in Kinesiology

The career opportunities for the associate of science degree in health and fitness are those related to the many facets of the fitness industry such as personal trainer, group exercise instructor, strength and conditioning, and fitness and wellness director.
