The goal of assessment is to make the student experience better. Failing to assess well is ultimately a failure to serve our students.

Focused on Growth

Thoughtful assessment can improve our teaching, stewardship of resources, and understanding of our students if we let it.

Faculty Driven

Faculty will be responsible for the assessment process and policies surrounding assessment.

Institutional Learning Outcomes

Institutional Learning Outcomes (ILOs) include the knowledge, skills, and abilities embedded within every aspect of our college to inspire and enhance each student's transferable learning skills. The ILOs represent the broad categories of competence that enable students to be successful in further education, careers, as citizens and in their personal lives. These ILOs were written collaboratively by faculty, approved by the Academic Senate, and mapped to PLOs.

Critical Thinking

Apply principles of logic to analyze problems, develop arguments, and derive conclusions.

Communication

Use various communication modalities effectively and participate in the exchange of ideas.

Information Literacy

Demonstrate the critical competencies for finding, assessing, synthesizing, and applying factual evidence from information sources in an ethical and legal manner.

Scientific Inquiry

Interpret quantitative and qualitative data logically to solve problems and innovate.

Aesthetics

Evaluate cultural and natural forms according to objective and subjective aesthetic criteria.

Professional Development

Self-evaluate knowledge, skills, and abilities in the pursuit of realistic goals.

Personal Development

Develop the self-awareness, confidence, and discipline to pursue intellectual curiosities.

Global Citizenship

Recognize the interconnectedness of global, national, and local concerns and develop respect for diverse cultures and viewpoints.

Ethics

Apply ethical reasoning to contemporary issues and moral dilemmas with integrity.

Social Justice

Recognize and respect diversity, promote equity, and practice environmental and social justices in our communities.

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Assessments

COD's Assessment Plan

College of the Desert engages in regular assessment of course, program, and institutional outcomes. Faculty are responsible for assessing course and program outcomes on a regular schedule. Every three years, each course-level SLO must be assessed based on a schedule developed by the faculty in each program. Assessment of program learning outcomes is often completed as part of the PEP and PEP-UP process.

Assessment allows faculty to analyze student learning in a systematic way in order to guide needed curricular updates or program changes. Assessment is a deliberate and faculty-driven process.

Assessments of both course and program learning outcomes are completed using eLumen.

External Resources for Assessment

- Shared Practice in Teaching and Teacher Education, a blog with good discussion of how formative assessments can provide valuable information of student learning during a course, allowing for faculty to make mid-term adjustments to enhance student learning. There are suggestions using varied online or technology-based tools for formative assessments.

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PEPs, PEP-UPs, and PRUs

PEPs and PEP-UPs

COD's Program Enhancement Plan (PEP) and Program Enhancement Plan Update (PEP-UP) are regular, formal reviews of our programs and services.

Every five years, programs complete the PEP and then this is annually updated in the PEP-UP. This process allows for a critical reflection of our work and allows us to assess future needs.

Through this process, faculty can determine how to best meet student need and ensure the continued success of our diverse student population.

PEPs and PEP-UPs are created within our eLumen assessment tool.

PRUs

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




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

Text from the image (in order from higher to lower-level thinking skills):

• Evaluation: make and defend judgments based on internal evidence or external criteria.

Appraise, argue, assess, attach, choose, compare, conclude, contrast, defend, describe, discriminate, estimate, evaluate, explain, judge, justify, interpret, relate, predict, rate, select, summarize, support, value

• Synthesis: compile component ideas into a new whole or propose alternate solutions.

Arrange, assemble, categorize, collect, combine, comply, compose, construct, create, design, develop, devise, explain, formulate, generate, plan, prepare, rearrange, reconstruct, relate, reorganize, revise, rewrite, set up, summarize, synthesize, write

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




