Group activity participation/observation	Students will work in groups to evaluate word choice in texts. Students will read selected passages then discuss and critique the meaning and affect of specific words.	In Class Only
Reading reports	Reports will articulate students' language critiques. (100% of homework assignments will be completed out of class, by definition.)	Out of Class Only
Critiques	Students will critique language meaning in texts. Students will read selected passages then discuss and critique the meaning and affect of specific words.	In Class Only
Written homework	Students will write a short essay as well as short responses to texts. (100% of homework assignments will be completed out of class, by definition.)	Out of Class Only
Other	Out-of-class hours will be accounted for electronically through the learning management system.	Out of Class Only

Other In-class Assignments

- 1. Read several short essays on a common topic that reflect different viewpoints and opinions.
- 2. Identify the main points and purpose of each essay.
- 3. In groups, create a list of words for each essay that students feel is important to the main point of each essay.
- 4. Identify the same/similar words used in each essay.



- 5. Define words from the list using basic dictionary definitions.
- 6. Analyze and discuss how the chosen words affect the political and social meaning of the text.
- Write a brief report about how language choice affects the perception of the topic and how the use of these words positions people in society.

Other Out-of-class Assignments

- 1. Choose a specific word that has currency in contemporary American culture and politics.
- 2. Find several articles on this topic.
- 3. Compare and contrast how word choice affects the meaning of this word/topic.
- 4. Draft a short essay on how word meaning and choice affects the topic.
