

Methods of Instruction

Discussion	Instructor will give a variety of forms of prompts and questions for students to answer in pairs, small groups, and with the whole class for open-ended, collaborative exchanges of ideas and practice of pronunciation and vocabulary.
Demonstration, Repetition/Practice	Instructor will introduce vocabulary words and phrases and have the students repeat aloud new vocabulary words, and use new phrases in presentations, conversations and role plays.
Role Playing	Instructor will give students prompts to create dialogues that involve interviewing each other and asking questions.
Participation	Instructor will give students prompts for students to collaborate with classmates through discussions, dialogues, and assignments.
Lecture	Instructor will lecture on conversation topics by presenting new vocabulary and phrases in various content areas. Instructor will present visuals, demonstrations and examples to help students understand main points.
