

- **10.49%** growth from 2010




# Palm Desert Campus

#### **Observations**

- College of the Desert opens in 1962 with a 3.7 million dollar, 9 building complex
- First-year enrollment : 524 full-time students
- 1964: First bond was used to add a Gym, Library, Nursing, Agriculture and Engineering Building











# Palm Desert Campus

#### Observations

- Freeway Access (11 min. to 10 n : 5 min. to 111 south)
- Three primary entries
  - Monterey entry well defined
  - Fred Waring and San Pablo entrances limited visual presence
- Primary entry/exit points are signalized.
- Right turn entry/exit only on Magnesia Falls
- Public Use Facilities along Fred Waring Drive
- Primary entries lead to Loop Road
- Limited on campus drop-off points
- No developed/dedicated bike access from campus perimeter







# Palm Desert Campus

#### Observations

- Limited defined/improved pedestrian connections to transit stops
- Buildings within core primarily have a shaded connection
- Subsequent improvements outside of historic core lack this shaded connection
- Pedestrian Access North of the loop road is not improved/defined





- Limited outdoor student spaces conducive to gather/study/relax





- D. Unprotected Pathway from Eastern Parking Lot







4 Poor condition: Significant repairs/ system replacements required




















