- Make sure the MOUs and CCAPs are in place.
- Need for coordinating high school faculty with COD faculty.
- Principals working directly with Michelle Bleza on dual and concurrent enrollment classes.
- Working more effectively on course articulation.
- Continue conversation about the K12 districts' interest in different bell schedules.

Discussion ensued on goals for 2018-2019:

- Amanda Phillips: important for placement purposes in light of AB 705 to motivate faculty in English and math to increase knowledge and connection of the transition. Also, COD faculty could benefit from more information about the curriculum at the high school level.
- Michelle Valenzuela: continue to grow collaboration between COD counselors and high school counselors.
- Michele Bleza: align concurrent/dual enrollment course-taking patterns with guided pathways so students can see a clear path to their associate's degree.
- Pamela Ralston: use subcommittees to include other key players (who aren't at Ed Consortium meetings) to better leverage time together at Ed Consortium meetings.
- Kim McNulty: leverage OneFutureCV groups already in place to increase opportunities for collaboration.
- Consider reconvening professional learning communities to bring faculty together within disciplines to strengthen collaboration and alignment (links to Amanda's item above)
 - Set clear goals for outcomes
- Ethnic studies <u>AB 2772</u> (pending legislation)
- Proposed subcommittees:
 - Increase knowledge and connections about math and English in light of placement changes (AB 705)
 - o Continue to grow COD/USD collaboration
 - Align dual enrollment offerings and academies with Guided Pathways



United Brotherhood of Carpenters - Local 944 Community College Apprenticeship May 3, 2018 Meeting Summary

On May 3, 2018, a meeting was held in Ontario CA at the Joint Apprenticeship Training Center for the United Brotherhood of Carpenters (UBC) Local 944. The purpose of the meeting was to explore the possibilities for a CA Community College pre-apprenticeship program that will provide access for students into the UBC apprenticeship program.

The meeting began with a tour of the training center facilities and programs. Carpenters are the first





workers on a construction and are there until the last day. They do everything from concrete forms for residential foundations, bridges, and skyscrapers to elaborate welded rod and mesh plaster designs for amusement park features. Carpenters work with wood creating cabinets, trim, molding, door and

window frames. They also use wood and steel to frame buildings, hang drywall, and create exterior and interior finishes. The UBC contractors hire welders, carpenters, framers, form workers, drywall installers, lathers, millwrights, construction managers, and more.

The Southwest Carpenters Training Fund provides all of the curriculum, instruction, and hands-on training that is required to place apprentice carpenters in the field and advance the skills of their journeyman. The training center is an impressive sight on its own and we were able to watch actual training in progress. After the tour, the Local 944 treated us to lunch and a discussion around community college apprenticeship programs ensued.

The UBC members from the regional council, training fund and Local 944 were all very enthusiastic about the possibility of collaboration with the community college system for pre-apprenticeship training and education that leads to direct access into their apprenticeship program. This is unprecedented in our region and will create a pathway for high school and college students to enter the UBC.

The UBC will provide all of the curricula and will help recruit instructors to teach in college classrooms. Their curriculum is designed to reach high school students in "Project 1" and "Math for the Trades" and is followed by "Project 2" and "Project 3" textbooks. Altogether there are approximately 500 hours of instruction both classroom and lab. Upon completion of this coursework successful students are granted direct access.

All of the textbooks including instructor versions and related resources i.e. CD's are available from the Southwest Carpenters Training Fund at a very reasonable cost. Instructors can receive professional development at the UBC training center in Las Vegas (train-the-trainer). We were encouraged by the UBC's commitment to support an apprenticeship pathway for our students.

The next step is to hold a joint meeting of deans, faculty, high school principals, and regional key talent, to develop a pilot with UBC representatives that will result in a model program for the region. Additionally, the UBC has offered guided tours of their training center (typically Wednesday's by appointment) for interested faculty, teachers, administrators, parents, and students. They can accommodate up to 30 at a time and would welcome busloads of high school students to build interest in the career path.

I would recommend the colleges use strong workforce funds to build a regional apprenticeship program and to reach out to their local school districts to arrange JATC tours as soon as possible. A three-pronged approach is likely to be successful and could be as follows:

- Stakeholder engagement (including potential students). Pilot High School Academies and CTE or CE programs
- 2) Curriculum review and approval and instructor recruitment
- 3) Program implementation and Student Orientation (Summer camp)

Ultimately, this pathway is ideal for inclusion in the Building and Energy Systems Professional (BESP) degree program. That concludes my report.
