REFUND POLICY

Refund deadlines vary for classes during each term. To qualify for a refund, a student must officially withdraw from the class by the refund deadline date on page 1.

Refunds, less a \$10.00 processing fee, will be processed automatically beginning March 9th and will either be mailed to the student's address on file with Admissions and Records, or returned as a credit to the credit card from which fees were originally paid. See refund policy in the course catalog for more information. Refunds of less than \$10 will not be processed and must be requested in person from the Bursar's Office.

REFUND DEADLINES

A community college district shall not refund any enrollment fee paid by a student for program changes made after the first two weeks of instruction for a primary term-length course, or after the 10 percent point of the length of the course for a short-term course, unless the program change is a result of action by the district to cancel or reschedule a class or to drop a student pursuant to subdivision (I) of section 55003 where the student fails to meet a prerequisite.

Enrollment, Health and Non-Resident Tuition Fees..... Refundable if dropped on or before February 8th. Student Representation Fee, Student ID Card Fee......Refundable if student completely withdraws by February 8th. By 10% point of length of class, for short-term classes. (Permit, receipt and proof of dropped classes must be returned to the Bursar's Office.)

Registration Deadlines and Schedule Terms

Enrollment Fee Deadline for Spring 2026

- Students are responsible for their tuition and fees.
 It is important for students to drop themselves by appropriate deadlines.
- Students registering on or after January 26th, must pay enrollment fees prior to the last day to drop a course. A financial hold will be placed on all student records that have an outstanding balance for the term that will prevent subsequent registration until paid.
- Drops for non-payment will not be processed once courses begin. Drops for non-payment will not be processed once the term begins.
- Students enrolled in courses they do not attend are responsible for enrollment fees and final grades if not dropped by the applicable course deadline. Students that have been awarded financial aid will not be dropped for non-payment.
- Petitions for refunds of courses not dropped by the deadline, will not be accepted if student fails to drop a course by the deadline.

Payment Plan Option

College of the Desert offers an optional payment plan to assist with the payment of enrollment fees. Please note there is a \$20 non-refundable enrollment fee per semester for this service. For more information on the payment plan, please go to collegeofthedesert.edu. Self Service. Finance.

Please note: Students are responsible for their class schedules and fee payments. Please check the accuracy of your class schedule by going to collegeofthedesert.edu. Go to MyCOD, then Self-Service.

The following terms are used throughout this Schedule of classes.

SECT/SYNONYM (in Self Service) - SECTION NUMBER: Every class is identified by a 4-digit section number. This number is critical to correctly register in the section you have selected.

COURSE - COURSE CODE: The course code identifies the department and course level.

TITLE - COURSE TITLE: The course title is the descriptive name of the course

U - **UNITS**: This is the number of credit units that will be earned by successfully completing the course.

SHORT-TERM CLASSES - Short-term classes are noted throughout the schedule with starting (first meeting:) and ending dates (last meeting:) listed under the class title in bold print. Registration deadline dates for these classes will differ from the published deadlines for full-term classes. See Self Service for specific section dates.

CROSS-LISTED or EQUIVALENT SECTIONS - One or more like courses scheduled at the same time. Enrollments of all cross-listed courses are considered by the registration system, possibly showing "course is filled" when it seems there are available seats.

TBA TIME - If hours are shown as 2.3 HOURS TBA, then 2 hours and 5 minutes weekly are required (usually lab) and are TO BE ARRANGED by the student during the time the appropriate lab facility is open.

- 1.Full-term classes meet only once during final exam week, at the scheduled exam time (right). If the exam start time does not appear on this page, the exam should start at the closest time after the regular start time of the class in the same room as the regularly scheduled class location.
- 2. **Short-term** classes meet as regularly scheduled during final exam week. The final exam is held at the last class meeting.
- 3. Off-Site day and night classes meet only once during final exam week, at the scheduled exam time (right). If the exam start time does not appear on this page, the exam should start at the closest time after the regular start time of the class.
- 4. West Valley Off-Site classes meet only once during final exam week, at the first regularly scheduled class starting time, for a two-hour exam.
- 5. **Saturday classes** meet as regularly scheduled during final exam week. The final exam is given during the last class meeting on May 16.
- 6. **Nursing/Health Sciences** exams are scheduled by the Health Sciences.
- 7. All students are expected to complete a final examination for all their registered courses as assigned by their instructor. All examinations will, so far as practicable, be conducted in writing and a maximum time will be assigned before each examination. Students are required to take the final examination at the appointed time and place. Students who are in need of special accommodations should arrange this with their instructor well in advance of taking the final exam.

Students who miss a final exam due to unforeseen circumstances, such as a sudden illness, should provide documented evidence to the instructor if the student is seeking a make-up exam. Any challenge or exception to this policy must be approved by the Vice President, Student Services or the Vice President's designated representative.

Student Registration Has Changed



College of the Desert has transitioned from WebAdvisor to Self-Service for online student access. **Beginning Summer 2023**, students began to use Self-Service to add/drop courses, add themselves to waitlists, and utilize the add authorization process to enroll in closed courses. Important information on Self-Service has been placed in the student portal.

Students will still register according to their registration priority in the student planning area of Self-Service. An instructional How to Register video can be found on the student portal.

WebAdvisor will no longer be available and

will be shut down on December 17, 2023.

The add code process has been replaced with Add Authorization via Self-Service to add a course during the *Add Authorization period*. Add Codes are not used.

Faculty, staff, and students may verify if a course requires approval to add a course (authorization to add) by using the tool below which is found in the Student Portal, Faculty Resource Webpage, and in the Catalogs & Schedules webpage.



In Self-Service, once the student receives instructor approval to add a course the authorized section will have a blue "Authorized for Add" flag on their schedule. When a student receives

instructor approval via Self-Service to add a course, the student will need to click the Register button to finish registering. Registration will process assuming all prerequisites and holds have been cleared.

Also, students should make sure to drop a course they have decided not to attend. Faculty are no longer required to drop during the semester. Not dropping a course will result in an FW grade.

What Is Work Experience?

College of the Desert's Work Experience Education is a unique academic program where students apply what they have learned in the classroom to a real work environment - all while earning college credit!

By enrolling in a Work Experience course, students will participate in experiential learning activities that will enhance their skill set and strengthen effective work habits. Additionally, students have the opportunity to be coached and mentored by a faculty advisor as a subject matter expert in the student's field of study.

All students who currently work, volunteer, intern, or that have a student worker or federal work study position are eligible to enroll. Credits earned are transferrable to the CSU system. Students may enroll in General Work Experience or an Occupational course based on the student's educational goal and current job-related duties.

General Work Experience (WEG - 095A)

WEG – 095A is for students who currently have a position that **does not** relate to the student's occupational/educational goal. **1 - 5** credits of General Work Experience per semester can be earned per semester providing that the hour requirement is met, (see chart on next page).

Occupational Work Experience (XXX - 095A)

Occupational courses, such as: AUTO-095A, KINE-095A, BUHM-095A, etc. are for students majoring in the respective field and have a current position that directly aligns with the major/educational goal. If their current position **does** relate to their educational/occupational goal, **1 - 5** credits in any occupational work experience course can be earned per semester, providing that the hour requirement is met, see chart on next page. Check out the full list of <u>participating Work Experience programs.</u>

Requirements

To enroll in a Work Experience course, students must:

- Have a declared major or career goal
- Have a job, internship, student worker, or volunteer position secured before enrolling
- Commit to the job/internship/volunteer position for the duration of the enrollment term (for example: 16-weeks, 12-weeks, or 8-weeks during summer)
- If you are not a current College of the Desert student, complete your Application for Admission.

Earning College Credit

The number of credits students may earn is based on how many hours the student will work per semester. Use the table on the next page to determine up to how many credits can be earned based work hours. Note that some academic programs, such as Automotive Technology only require 2 credits of Work Experience, others more. See list of <u>participating Work Experience programs</u> to view number of credits required.

Once enrolled via Self Service, students must complete three learning objectives, required course assignments and forms. All course content can be found via Canvas 24/7. Work Experience courses meet a total of four times (Zoom meetings are acceptable).

If student is actively seeking an internship/job, take into consideration school schedule and time-management skills, along with the agency needs, to determine hour commitment towards the internship/job throughout the semester.

Use the chart below to help you pre-determine up to how many units you may qualify to earn based on the number of hours you will complete. When registering via Self Service, you must choose from the drop-down menu to select the number of units you qualify for. There are no exceptions to the minimum hour requirements for paid or unpaid positions.

What to Expect Out of a Work Experience Class:

- Work Experience classes are non-traditional the majority of the work is completed at the student's job site!
- Students meet a total of four (4) times during the course; two on campus with their Work Experience Instructor, and two at the student's job site with their Work Experience Instructor and supervisor. (Zoom meetings are acceptable).
- During the course, students will develop and work on three (3) S.M.A.R.T. goals/objectives and have the opportunity to apply and enhance the following 21st-century Employability Skills:
 - Adaptability
 - 2. Self-Awareness
 - 3. Digital Fluency
 - 4. Communication
 - 5. Collaboration
 - 6. Empathy
 - 7. Analysis/Solution Mindset
 - 8. Resilience
 - 9. Entrepreneurial Mindset
 - 10. Social/Diversity Awareness
- Students will participate in a Final Job Site Evaluation where they will receive constructive feedback from their supervisor related to the completion of the three SMART goals and their application of the 10 Employability Skills listed above.
- All course content is available via Canvas 24/7. Students are expected to log-in on the first day of class.

Accounting

The Bureau of Labor Statistics projects that 166,700 new accounting and auditing jobs will open up by 2022. This means the demand for well-educated accounting professionals will increase over 13 percent between now and then. Organizations large to small, domestic or global require financial guidance from professionals with accounting knowledge who can prepare, analyze, verify, and communicate financial information.

Most students don't realize the variety of accounting jobs the profession has to offer. Whereas, Forensic Accountants merge accounting with investigative legal work, Public Accountants are tasked with accounting, auditing, taxes, and consulting. Management Accountants work with decision makers within a company, and Non-Profit/Government Accountants are employed by various public agencies.

At College of the Desert students interested in pursuing a career in accounting can earn either a Certificate of Achievement in Accounting, an A.S. degree in accounting for employment preparation, or both, providing students with the skills necessary for employment or advancement in the accounting profession.

Additionally, students can earn a Bachelor's Degree without ever leaving the desert! Just complete the transfer AA Business Degree at COD and then finish the upper division accounting program at the Palm Desert campus of CSUSB.

If so, then Descriptive Astronomy, A-001 or A-002 will give you an opportunity to learn the answers to all these questions, plus learn how COD's state of the art, remotely operated 1-meter telescope at the Mary Reagan Observatory works.

Both A-001 and A-002 fulfill the natural science elective and will transfer to the UCs and Cal States. The only difference is A-002 is a (4) unit class that includes a laboratory component, while A-001 is a (3) unit lecture only class. Also, if you need a natural science elective with a lab, A-002 fills that requirement.

BI 007: Biology of Mammals and BI 007L: Biology of Mammals, Lab

The characteristics of mammals is briefly covered in Biology (BI 004) and Biology of Organisms (BI 006). Biology of Mammals (BI 007) covers all the major orders of mammals in depth, as well as their anatomy and physiology, ecology, evolution, distribution, domestication, and conservation.

The lecture and lab are designed to fulfill the natural science elective (same as BI 004) and have been accepted for transfer to the UCs and Cal States. This is the only biology course offered in the science department in which the lecture and lab are two separate courses, so that if students need only one or the other, they can be accommodated.

In addition to a natural science elective, these courses can also be taken by science majors who have fulfilled their biology requirements (BI 005 and BI 006) and want to take more biology while waiting to fulfill the rest of their science requirements (chemistry, math, physics, etc.).





Ethnic Studies

Ethnic Studies is the interdisciplinary study of race and racism utilizing intersectional, comparative, relational, and transnational approaches that focus on the histories, experiences, cultures, and struggles of historically minoritized ethnoracial groups in the United States.

The field focuses primarily on Indigenous/Native American studies, Black/African American studies, Latinx/Chicanx studies, and Asian American/Pacific Islander studies, while also engaging in analysis of other racialized ethnic groups in the U.S.

The Earth Sciences (G-010) is intended for students with a strong science background. This rigorous, fast-paced course is a survey of astronomy, meteorology, climatology, oceanography, and geology.

Physical Geology (G-001) serves as an introduction to the field for majors and those looking to fulfill their general education requirement. Subject matter for this course includes Earth materials and processes such as minerals, rocks, plate tectonics, earthquakes, and volcanoes.

The lecture and lab for both courses are designed to fulfill the natural science elective and have been accepted for transfer to the UC and CSU systems in addition to meeting the requirements of IGETC.

Due to the demanding course load of The Earth Sciences (G-010), the Physical Geology (G-001) may be a better option unless G-010 is required for certificate or degree completion.

Geology classes have moved to the Liberal Arts Building

Due to construction and a complete remodel of the Science building, Geology classes on the Palm Desert campus will be held in the Liberal Arts building, room 9B.



If a student has taken 1, 2, or more years of Spanish in high school or another institution, he/she may take the Spanish placement exam to determine his/her proficiency level. He/she may be placed in SPAN 002-Elementary Spanish II (5 units),

Spanish for Heritage Speakers Track

A student can be considered as a heritage speaker of Spanish if Spanish and English are spoken at home and/or Spanish is spoken very often. If a student can ask and answer questions orally in Spanish but he/she does not know how to read and write in Spanish, he/she must be enrolled in SPAN 021-Spanish for Heritage Speakers I (5 units). If a student can ask and answer questions orally in Spanish and have basic knowledge of how to read and write in Spanish, he/she must be enrolled in SPAN 022-Spanish for Heritage Speakers II (5 units).

Spanish Placement Test

Prerequisites can be waived either by taking the Spanish Placement Test with a Spanish faculty or by meeting with a counselor and receive the approval. To ensure the correct placement in a Spanish course, students can self-enroll in the Spanish Placement Test on CANVAS on December 1, 5:00-7:00pm, December 15, 10:00-12:00pm.
