

NON-PAYMENT DROPS

Enrollment Fees must be paid within three (3) days of enrolling (count the day enrolled as the first day) to avoid being dropped for non-payment.

Students enrolled in courses they do not attend are responsible for enrollment fees and final grades if not dropped by applicable course deadline.

Petitions to drop past the established deadline are not accepted for courses not dropped due to lack of awareness of the withdrawal procedure or deadline. An online Course Information Report is available to provide all pertinent course deadline information.

REFUND POLICY

Refund deadlines vary for classes during each summer term. To qualify for a refund, a student must officially withdraw from the class by the Refund Deadline date on page 5.

Refunds, less a \$10.00 processing fee, will be processed automatically beginning July 20, 2026 and will either be mailed to the student's address on file with Admissions and Records, or returned as a credit to the credit card from which fees were originally paid. See Refund Policy in the Course Catalog for more information. Refunds of less than \$10 will not be processed and must be requested in person from the Bursar's Office.

REFUND DEADLINES:

A community college district shall not refund any enrollment fee paid by a student for program changes made after the first two weeks of instruction for a primary term-length course, or after the 10 percent point of the length of the course for a short-term course, unless the program change is a result of action by the district to cancel or reschedule a class or to drop a student pursuant to subdivision (I) of section 55003 where the student fails to meet a prerequisite.

Enrollment, Health and Non-Resident Tuition Fees..... Refundable if dropped on the 2nd day of a 4-week or 6-week class, the 3rd day of an 8-week class.

Student Representation Fee and Transportation Fee..... Refundable if student completely withdraws by the 2nd day of a 4 or 6-week class, the 3rd day of an 8-week class. (Permit, receipt and proof of dropped classes must be returned to the Bursar's Office.)

Student Registration Has Changed



College of the Desert has transitioned from WebAdvisor to Self-Service for online student access. **Beginning Summer 2023**, students began to use Self-Service to add/drop courses, add themselves to waitlists, and utilize the add authorization process to enroll in closed courses. Important information on Self-Service has been placed in the student portal.

Students will still register according to their registration priority in the student planning area of Self-Service. An instructional How to Register video can be found on the student portal.

WebAdvisor will no longer be available and will be shut down on December 17, 2023.

The add code process has been replaced with Add Authorization via Self-Service to add a course during the *Add Authorization period*. Add Codes are not used.

Faculty, staff, and students may verify if a course requires approval to add a course (authorization to add) by using the tool below which is found in the Student Portal, Faculty Resource Webpage, and in the Catalogs & Schedules webpage.



In Self-Service, once the student receives instructor approval to add a course the authorized section will have a blue “Authorized for Add” flag on their schedule. When a student receives

instructor approval via Self-Service to add a course, the student will need to click the Register button to finish registering. Registration will process assuming all prerequisites and holds have been cleared.

Also, students should make sure to drop a course they have decided not to attend. Faculty are no longer required to drop during the semester. Not dropping a course will result in an FW grade.

What Is Work Experience Education?

College of the Desert's Work Experience Education is a unique academic program where students apply what they have learned in the classroom to a real work environment - all while earning college credit!

By enrolling in a Work Experience course, students will participate in experiential learning activities that will enhance their skill set and strengthen effective work habits. Additionally, students have the opportunity to be coached and mentored by a faculty advisor as a subject matter expert in the student's field of study.

All students who currently work, volunteer, intern, or that have a student worker or federal work study position are eligible to enroll. Credits earned are transferrable to the CSU system. Students may enroll in General Work Experience or an Occupational course based on the student's educational goal and current job-related duties.

General Work Experience (WEG-095A)

WEG-095A is for students who currently have a position that **does not** relate to the student's occupational/educational goal. 1-5 credits of General Work Experience per semester can be earned per semester providing that the hour requirement is met. See chart below.

Occupational Work Experience (XXX-095A)

Occupational courses, such as: AUTO-095A, KINE-095A, BUHM-095A, etc. are for students majoring in the respective field and have a current position that directly aligns with the major/educational goal. If their current position **does** relate to their educational/occupational goal, 1-5 credits in any occupational work experience course can be earned per semester, providing that the hour requirement is met. Registration Details

1. Student must have a job, internship, volunteer, student worker, or federal work study position to enroll.
2. Determine the number of units to enroll in (based on the hours you work, see chart below).
3. Determine which course you will be enrolling in: General or an Occupational course (see description above). If you need further assistance, contact the Work Experience Office before enrolling.
4. Enroll via Self Service:
 - Use the chart below to help you pre-determine up to how many units you may qualify to earn based on the number of hours you will complete. When registering via Self Service, you must choose from the drop-down menu to select the number of units you qualify for. There are no exceptions to the minimum hour requirement.
5. Check CANVAS by the first day of class to complete required forms and get started on the course.

Additional occupational courses may be available if not listed on Self Service. Call the Work Experience office for details.







The field focuses primarily on Indigenous/Native American studies, Black/African American studies, Latinx/Chicana studies, and Asian American/Pacific Islander studies, while also engaging in analysis of other racialized ethnic groups in the U.S.

Ethnic Studies also investigates how race and ethnicity intersect with class, gender, ability, and sexuality in order to help students develop a critical understanding of the complex and intersecting historical struggles and movements for social transformation, resistance, and liberation in the U.S. and beyond.




