REFUND POLICY

Refund deadlines vary for classes during each term. To qualify for a refund, a student must officially withdraw from the class by the Refund Deadline date on page 1.

Refunds, less a \$10.00 processing fee, will be processed automatically beginning October 2nd and will either be mailed to the student's address on file with Admissions and Records, or returned as a credit to the credit card from which fees were originally paid. See Refund Policy in the Course Catalog for more information. Refunds of less than \$10 will not be processed and must be requested in person from the Bursar's Office.

REFUND DEADLINES:

A community college district shall not refund any enrollment fee paid by a student for program changes made after the first two weeks of instruction for a primary term-length course, or after the 10 percent point of the length of the course for a short-term course, unless the program change is a result of action by the district to cancel or reschedule a class or to drop a student pursuant to subdivision (l) of section 55003 where the student fails to meet a prerequisite.

RETURNED CHECK SERVICE CHARGE

Checks returned for non-sufficient funds or "Stop Payments" will be charged a \$25.00 service fee. There will be a hold put on your records and your enrollment at College of the Desert, and your credit may be affected.

Enrollment Fee Deadline for Fall 2022

- To avoid being dropped from classes for non-payment, students must pay within three (3) days of registration for the Fall 2022 term. Count the day you enroll as the first day to prevent being dropped for non-payment.
- Students registering on or after August 26 must pay enrollment fees prior to the last day to drop a course. A financial hold will be placed on all student records that have an outstanding balance for the term that will prevent subsequent registration until paid.
- **Drops for non-payment will not be processed once courses begin. Drops for non-payment will not be processed once term begins.**
- Students enrolled in courses they do not attend are responsible for enrollment fees and final grades if not dropped by the applicable course deadline. Students that have been awarded financial aid will not be dropped for non-payment.
- Petitions to drop past the deadline, or for refunds of courses not dropped by the deadline, will not be accepted if student fails to drop a course by the deadline.

PAYMENT PLAN OPTION

College of the Desert offers an optional payment plan to assist with the payment of enrollment fees. Please note there is a \$20 nonrefundable enrollment fee per semester for this service. The following terms are used throughout this Schedule of classes.

SECT/SYNONYM (in Web Advisor) - SECTION NUMBER:

Every class is identified by a 4-digit section number. This number is critical to correctly register in the section you have selected.

COURSE - COURSE CODE - The course code identifies the department and course level.

TITLE - COURSE TITLE - The course title is the descriptive name of the course.

U - UNITS - This is the number of credit units that will be earned by successfully completing the course.

SHORT-TERM CLASSES - Short-term classes are noted throughout the schedule with starting (First Meeting:) and ending dates (Last Meeting:) listed under the class title in **bold print**. Registration deadline dates for these classes will differ from the published deadlines for full-term classes.

CROSS-LISTED or EQUIVALENT SECTIONS - One or more like courses scheduled at the same time. Enrollments of all cross-listed courses are considered by the registration system, possibly showing “course is filled” when it seems there are available seats.

CLASS SECTIONS IN BOLD PRINT - Evening classes, beginning at 4:00 p.m. or later, are indicated in **bold print**.

TBA TIME - If hours are shown as 2.3 HOURS TBA, then 2 hours and 5 minutes weekly are required (usually lab) and are TO BE ARRANGED by the student during the time the appropriate lab facility is open.

IGETC courses in this schedule are printed in color, and the IGETC requirement satisfied by each course is listed along with each course prerequisites.


The symbol (▶) in front of a section number (▶2315) denotes an off-campus class.

Assembly Bill (AB) 705

The State of California has enacted a new law affecting community college students. Assembly Bill 705 requires colleges to maximize the probability that students will complete transfer-level English and math within one year. The assessment test for English and math will no longer be administered and all students can now directly enroll in transfer-level English and math courses.



What Is Work Experience?

A course that allows students to apply their education to the real world. Students create and accomplish three measurable learning objectives that are new and/or expanded responsibilities at their workplace. This ultimately empowers students to become better employees, work on new projects, add to their resume, and enhance their job skills. All students who currently work, volunteer, intern, or that have a student worker or federal work-study position are eligible. Units earned are transferrable to the CSU system and the class fits easily into the student's work and school schedule. Students may enroll in General Work Experience or an Occupational course

General Work Experience (WEG-095A)

Students may enroll in **General Work Experience (WEG – 095A)** if the student's current position **does not** relate to their occupational/educational goal. Students can earn **1 - 6 units** of General Work Experience per semester (if hour requirement is met, see below). All General sections will be listed under Work Experience.

Occupational Work Experience (XXX-095A)

Students may enroll in an Occupational course if their current position **does** relate to their educational/occupational goal. Occupational courses vary depending on student's major and are listed under the corresponding academic program as (XXX – 095A), i.e. CIS-095A, BUMA-095A, FIRE-095A, etc. Students may earn **1 - 8 units** in any occupational work experience course (if hour requirement is met, see below). Additional occupational courses may be available if not listed on Self Service.

Note to Students: Use the chart below to help you pre-determine up to how many units you may qualify to earn based on the number of hours you will complete. You must **manually** enter the number of units via Self Service if you are enrolling in more than one (1) unit (see image on next page). There are no exceptions to the minimum hour requirements for paid or unpaid positions.



If so, then Descriptive Astronomy, A-001 or A-002 will give you an opportunity to learn the answers to all these questions plus learn how COD's state of the art, remotely operated 1-meter telescope at the Mary Reagan Observatory works.

Both A-001 and A-002 fulfill the natural science elective and will transfer to the UCs and Cal States. The only difference is A-002 is a (4) unit class that includes a laboratory component while A-001 is (3) unit lecture only class. Also, if you need a natural science elective with a lab, A-002 fills that requirement.







What Spanish Courses to Take

The following information will help you select the Spanish course you need to take according to your proficiency level.

Spanish as a Foreign Language Track

A student can take Spanish as a Foreign Language if he/she is a native speaker of English or another foreign language. If a student has never taken Spanish, he/she must be enrolled in SPAN 001-Elementary Spanish I (5 units). If a student has taken 1, 2, or more years of Spanish in high school or another institution, he/she may take the Spanish placement exam to determine his/her proficiency level. He/she may be placed in SPAN 002-Elementary Spanish II (5 units), SPAN 003-Intermediate Spanish I (4 units), or SPAN 004 – Intermediate Spanish II (4 units).

Spanish for Heritage Speakers Track

A student can be considered as a heritage speaker of Spanish if Spanish and English are spoken at home and/or Spanish is spoken very often. If a student can ask and answer questions orally in Spanish but he/she does not know how to read and write in Spanish, he/she must be enrolled in SPAN 021-Spanish for Heritage Speakers I (5 units). If a student can ask and answer questions orally in Spanish and have basic knowledge of how to read and write in Spanish, he/she must be enrolled in SPAN 022-Spanish for Heritage Speakers II (5 units).
