



## University of Redlands School of Business Transfer Policy

Each student must earn 42 semester credits of general education, distributed as follows:

<b>University of Redlands School of Business General Education</b>	
<b>Category</b>	<b>Minimum Credit Requirement</b>
Arts and Humanities (AH)	12 semester credits
Behavioral/Social Science (SS)	9 semester credits
Natural Science/Math (MS)	9 semester credits; at least 3 credits of math and 1 credit of science
Writing/Communication (WC)	6 semester credits; at least 1 course in English composition

**Note:** Undergraduate programs in the School of Business contain courses that fulfill some, but not all, of the general education requirements. Refer to the *School of Business Graduation Requirements* chapter in the *University of Redlands Catalog* or consult with the department of Graduate and Professional Enrollment for more information. 6 of the required 42 general education credits may be fulfilled in any area above.

### IGETC

Courses completed with a grade of C (2.0) or higher at all participating colleges through Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) will transfer to the University of Redlands School of Business as follows:

Area 4 Social and Behavioral Sciences	Behavioral/Social Science credit (SS)
Area 5 Physical and Biological Sciences	Natural Science Credit (MS)
Area 6 Language other than English	Arts and Humanities credit (AH)

### CSU Gen Ed

Courses completed with a grade of C (2.0) or higher at all participating colleges through CSU Gen Ed Curriculum will transfer to the University of Redlands School of Business as follows:

Area A English Language Communication and Critical Thinking (WC)	
Area A1 Oral Communication	Writing/Communication credit (WC)
Area A2 Written Communication	Writing/Communication credit (WC)
Area A3 Critical Thinking	Arts and Humanities credit (AH)
Area B Scientific Inquiry/Quantitative Reasoning	
Area B1 Physical Science	Natural Science credit (MS)
Area B2 Life Science	Natural Science credit (MS)
Area B3 Laboratory Activity	Natural Science credit (MS)
Area B4 Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning	Mathematics credit (MS)
Area C Arts and Humanities	Arts and Humanities credit (AH)
Area D Social Science	Behavioral/Social Science credit (SS)
Area E Lifelong Learning and Self-Development	Will not fulfill general education at the University of Redlands

#### Notes:

- Courses listed in more than one area of the IGETC/CSU Gen Ed will apply to one area, but not both.
- If a mathematics course on the IGETC or CSU Gen Ed is below the College Algebra level, it will not fulfill Redlands' math requirement and will be excluded from this agreement.
